I. <u>Review</u>

- Vocabulary about subjects: biology, literature....
- Ways to pass your turn in speaking : How about you? What do you think?

II. <u>Grammar</u>

- 1. Using "and"/ "or" for listing
 - We use "and" to join two or more nouns in a positive sentence.
 - Ex: (+) I like <u>math</u> and <u>biology</u>.
 - (+) I like math, biology, and music.
 - We use "or" to join two or more nouns in a negative sentence.
 - Ex: (-) I don't like <u>math</u> or <u>biology</u>.
 - (-) I don't like math, biology, or music.
- 2. Possessive pronouns: mine and yours
- We use "mine" or "yours" so we don't say the same words (e.g. ... your favorite subject) again.
 - Ex: A: My favorite subject is <u>physics</u>. What's **yours**?B: Mine's <u>English.</u>

(yours = your favorite subject) (mine = my favorite subject)

• Notes:

my + <u>noun</u>	It's mine.
your + <u>noun</u>	It's yours.

3. Structure: Wh-questions

- What subjects do you like?
 - → I like English and biology. / I like math, English, and music.
- What subjects don't you like?
 - → I don't like biology and physics. / I don't like biology, physics, or history.

III. Pronunciation

• Intonation for lists goes up, up, then down.

Ex: I like history, math, and geography.
