Eg. : I let him try once more.
3. **make plans** / meik plænz / (phr) = plan : to arrange to do sth
4. **national park** / 'næʃənl pɑ:k / (phr) : large area of land protected by the government because of its beauty
5. **teen camp** / ti:n kæmp / (phr) : place where teens stay and enjoy outdoor activities usually in the summer
